SUBJECT: INSPECTORS

As you know, the precincts are staffed by City Election Inspectors. The appointment letters will be mailed to the inspectors immediately following their appointment. We would like the Commission to approve the entire list of election inspectors. We would also like to appoint the City Clerk's staff as receiving board inspectors for purposes of reviewing materials at the end of the night. Due to the increase in the number of absentee ballots, we will have two Absent Voter Counting Boards for all elections. This will help to speed the process of tallying absentee ballots on Election Day.

The motion I recommended below would also authorize the City Clerk to make emergency appointments of election inspectors if needed, for example, if we had a last minute need for replacement election inspectors.

As a point of clarification and information to the Commission, the inspectors report to work on Election Day as follows: Precinct Chairs and Vice-Chairs report to work at 5:15 a.m. and General Inspectors report to work at 5:45 a.m. and the Absent Voter Counting Board Inspectors at 9:00 a.m.

Attached is the current list of individuals who will be receiving letters. I recommend that all be appointed as needed, and the following motion is recommended:

That the Election Inspectors for the November 8, 2016 General Election, be appointed to serve as Election Inspectors as needed, that the Chair and Vice-Chairs, Katelyn Zeits, Kim Lautner and Katy McBenge, be appointed to serve as the Election Receiving Board, and that the City Clerk be authorized to make emergency appointments of Election Inspectors if necessary, as recommended by the City Clerk in his memo of October 5, 2016.

BRIDGES REPAIR AND IMPROVEMENT
MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL**

This proposal is for the purpose of renewing the previously authorized Local Streets, Roads, Highways, and Bridges Repair and Improvement Millage in the same amount of 1 mill beginning with the December 2016 tax levy for repair and improvement of streets, roads, highways, and bridges within Grand Traverse County.

Shall the previously voted increase in the tax limitation on the total amount of taxes that may be levied against all taxable property within Grand Traverse County of up to and including 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) be renewed in the amount of up to and including 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for 4 years, beginning 2016 through 2019, inclusive, on all taxable property within Grand Traverse County for the purpose of repair and improvement of streets, roads, highways, and bridges within Grand Traverse County? If approved and levied in full, the renewal millage will generate an estimated \$4,620,529 in revenue to be disbursed to the Grand Traverse County Road Commission, the City of Traverse City, the Village of Kingsley, and the Village of Fife Lake for road, street, highway, and bridge repairs and improvements when first levied in 2016.

By law, tax increment revenues from this millage will be distributed to governmental units within Grand Traverse County that are entitled to receive a portion of this millage, which are the City of Traverse City Downtown Development Authority, Grand Traverse County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Grand Traverse County Land Bank Authority, Village of Kingsley Downtown Development Authority, Village of Fife Lake Downtown Development Authority, and Interlochen Downtown Development Authority.

COUNTY**VETERANS AFFAIRS MILLAGE**

Shall the 15 mill tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes within Grand Traverse County be increased as provided by Article IX, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, and the County of Grand Traverse be authorized to levy up to .12 mills (12.0 cents per \$1,000 taxable value) for a period of six years (2016-2021, inclusively), on all taxable property within Grand Traverse County for the purpose of operating a county Department of Veterans' Affairs which will provide support and assistance to veterans residing in Grand Traverse County, which increase shall raise in the first year of the levy, if fully captured, an estimated \$563,000.

By law, tax increment revenues from this millage will be distributed to governmental units within Grand Traverse County that capture property taxes, which are the City of Traverse City Downtown Development Authority, Grand Traverse County Brownfield Authority, Village of Kingsley Downtown Development Authority, Village of Fife Lake Downtown Development Authority and Interlochen Downtown Development Authority.


