

History of Hickory Hills

Hickory Hills began operations in the winter of 1951-52 on 12 City owned acres. Adjacent land was leased or used by friendly agreement. The City now owns approximately 125 acres. The lodge that was constructed in the mid 1950's is still in use today with a fireplace and snack bar for the enjoyment of our guests.

Hickory Hills currently features 8 runs with 1 beginner, 5 intermediate, and 2 advanced runs that are serviced by 5 rope tows. Night skiing is available on 7 of the runs. A terrain park is located on the "Swede" run. Cross Country skiers will find 3 K of trails with a 1 K trail lighted for night skiing at Hickory Hills. Additional trails are on the adjacent Hickory Meadows property.

Since the 2001-2002 ski season, \$1.00 of each daily ticket and \$5.00 of each season pass has been set aside for future Hickory Hills improvements.

The tow ropes at Hickory Hills provide a unique training environment for young skiers to learn balance and stability, build strength on their skis, and become an independent skier at a very early age.
