3. Meeting called to order at 12:02 PM
4. Discussion about On street overnight parking
 - a. Consensus was that this is a part time (during major festivals), part city (near the commercial district) issue; not a City wide problem
 - b. Recommendation that No new City Wide ordinance be recommended to the Planning Commission
5. Recommendations to Planning Commission / City / DDA relative to Over Night parking issue:
 - a. Parking decks should All have provisions for overnight parking, any new parking decks should also comply
 - b. Allow Temporary Overnight Parking through out the City by a special Temporary Parking Permit. Permit to be issued to a specific address for parking in front of that residence, if allowed, for a specified period of time (less than One week). An administrative fee for the permit may be charged.
 - c. Encourage Enforcement of parking regulations relative to Overnight parking ; and all other parking regulations
6. Next topic for discussion – Remote Parking for people coming into Traverse City or Spillover Parking issue
7. Public Comment
 - a. Elizabeth Whalen supports Temporary Permits
 - b. Jan Kleelan Thinks no Temporary Permits are needed since Police do not ticket now if you call them
