RESOLUTION TO TAKE BACK THE TAP

Because, Americans bought a total of 33 billion 16 ounce bottles of water in 2006 sold in plastic bottles, mostly made of polyethylene terephthalate (PET),

requiring nearly 900,000 tons of the plastic produced from fossil fuels; and

Because, it is estimated that producing the bottles for American consumption

requires the equivalent of more than 17 million barrels of oil, not including the energy for transportation, requiring three liters of water to produce each liter of bottled water, producing more than 2.5 million tons

of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas; and

Because, the City of Traverse City Water Plant provides some of the highest-quality

water in the nation equal to or exceeding the quality of bottled water; and

Because, bottled water is approximately 4,000 times more expensive than tap water,

the average price for bottled water is approximately \$1 per pint bottle or \$8 per gallon and the average price for Traverse City water is only 1/5 of

1 cent per gallon; and

Because, the City of Traverse signed the US Mayor's Climate Protection Agreement

to address climate disruption by enacting policies and programs to reduce

greenhouse gas emissions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City of Traverse City will no longer purchase bottled water for use

in City of Traverse City facilities or at City of Traverse City events, effective immediately, except for specific authorization by the City

Manager for emergency or other unique circumstances.
