

City of Traverse City Street Closing Permit - Community Event/Major Event

Pursuant to Section 1020.05 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Traverse City, Michigan, the following streets are hereby permitted to be closed or utilized on: August 30, 2025 from 8am to 4pm

Streets: Bay Street, between Division Street & Randolph Street

Event Organizer: Traverse City Elks Lodge #323 (Walter Muellenhagen - Applicant)

Event Title: Elk Camino Car Show

Shall have exclusive use and supervisory and control authority over said streets on the date and during the time period above indicated subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Applicant shall furnish to the City Clerk's office a certificate of insurance for Comprehensive General Liability Certificate in the amount of \$1 million per occurrence along with an endorsement to the policy naming the City of Traverse City as additional insured. If alcohol is being served, the applicant shall furnish to the City Clerk's office a Certificate of Insurance for liquor liability in the amount of \$1 million per occurrence along with an endorsement to the policy naming the City of Traverse City as additional insured.
- 2. The Applicant shall be liable for all damages both to property and person and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, actual attorney fees, and settlement expenses resulting or arising out of or in connection with the performance of the act for which this permit is issued. The obligations to defend indemnify and hold harmless shall exclude only those matters in which the claim arises out of allegations of the sole negligence or act of the City, its officers, agents or employees.

- 3. The Applicant shall reimburse the City for expenses such as police, fire, streets, and others as agreed upon between the City and the applicant and will be billed accordingly.
- 4. The Applicant shall maintain a 20' wide center lane (10' on both sides of the center line) for emergency vehicles.
- 5. The Applicant shall provide watchmen and flagmen as may be necessary for the safety and convenience of the public and shall furnish all barricades, signs and lights necessary to protect the public and/or such additional barricades, signs and lights as required per part VI of the current Michigan Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MMUTCD).
- 6. The Applicant shall notify in writing all affected property owners and occupants at least two (2) weeks before the event. This may include an area surrounding the event. The Notice shall include the name of the event, a description of the event, time period, and the name and telephone number of a contact person.
- 7. If located within the Central Business District / boundaries of the Downtown Development Authority and not an event which continuously moves and closes a segment of street(s) for no greater than one (1) hour, the applicant shall submit a supporting petition signed by at least 50 percent of the occupiers of the footage fronting on the public street on both sides of the street by block. For buildings with more than one (1) business, this calculation will be determined by counting the number of ground floor units, or the building owner may sign on behalf of the entire building.
- 8. The application is attached hereto and made a part of this permit.
- 9. The tent/canopy membrane material shall be non-combustible, flame resistant, or treated in an approved manner in accordance with the State Building Code. On-site inspection will be done by the Fire Marshal; it is the responsibility of the Permit Holder to arrange such inspection at least seven (7) days prior to the event.
- 10. The Applicant is responsible for any cleanup following this event and any damage done to City property and will be billed accordingly.

- 11. The rights granted by this permit are revocable at the will of the City of Traverse City, and the Applicant waives any right to claim damages or compensation in the event that this permit is revoked.
- 12. This permit may not be transferred or assigned.

19. Detailed Narrative

The Traverse City Elks Lodge (Elks) plans to hold its first annual Car Show on August 30, 2025. The location will be on Bay Street from Division Street to the east end of the Smith-Johnson building next door. There is a shared entrance to the Elks parking lot on the east end of the Smith-Johnson building that will provide ingress and egress to the Elks parking lot for visitors. The entrance to the parking lot located on Randolph Street will also remain open.

The plan is to park the cars on Bay Street diagonally on the south side of the street and parallel on the north side. We will utilize only the portion of Bay Street that is blocked off for the show cars.

Show hours are from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM, with setup beginning at 8:00 AM. Tear down will be completed by 4:00 PM.

The event will be open to the public. The Elks Lodge has a Members Only restaurant and lounge operating under a Club License issued by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission (MCC). Under rules of the MLCC for Club Liquor Licenses we are allowed twelve special/public licenses per calendar year. We have applied for a public license for this event.

We have a patio that is fenced in with access from the Lodge building. We will be fencing off a portion of our front yard (facing Bay Street) so Members, guests and visitors can eat and drink on the lawn too. We have done this for many events in the past.

The Lodge will also be grilling and selling hot dogs/brats and hamburgers on the patio for consumption on the premises. We will also have either a DJ or live music positioned on the patio. It is anticipated that performance hours will be from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM. The Lodge has an entertainment endorsement from the MLCC for such events.

Because this is an event open to the public, we will have trained security at the main entrance to the Lodge to ensure no alcohol leaves the building into the open yard.

The Lodge is partnering with Hagerty Insurance for logistical and operational support only. Hagerty Insurance will receive no remuneration for its support, and they are not a sponsor of the event.

FEDERAL SECTION 501(c)(8) TAX EXEMPT STATUS

GRAND LODGE AND SUBORDINATE LODGES OF BENEVOLENT AND PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Background

- 1. Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America ("BPOE") is a fraternal order operating under the lodge system, consisting of a central organization (Grand Lodge) and more than 2,000 subordinate lodges chartered by the Grand Lodge. BPOE has been in existence since June 1885.
- 2. By letter dated February 21, 1939, to BPOE 'from John H. Kirk, Deputy Commissioner of Internal Revenue, the ruling was issued that: "In view of the foregoing, it is held that you come within the exemption provisions of Section 101(3) of the Revenue Act of 1938 and similar provisions of prior revenue acts. You will accordingly be relieved of the duty of filing returns of annual income so long as your purposes and actual activities remain unchanged." [Section 101(3) was the predecessor of present Section 501(c)(8), re-numbered in Internal Revenue Code of 1954].
- 3. By letter dated October 18, 1951 to BPOE from E. I. McLarney, Deputy Commissioner of Internal Revenue, it was stated that: "It is the opinion of this office, based upon the evidence presented that your subordinate lodges appearing in your 1951-1952 Directory are entitled to exemption from Federal income tax under the provisions of Section 101(3) of the Code." Accordingly, a group exemption was issued under Section 101(3). [Group number 1156.]
- 4. The Grand Lodge has annually provided to the Internal Revenue Service in the prescribed form a list of all additions and deletions in its subordinate lodges.
- 5. The determinations dated February 21, 1939 and October 18, 1951 issued by the Internal Revenue Service remain in effect and have not been modified. Those rulings establish that that the BPOE Grand Lodge and all listed subordinates are exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 6. The exempt status of Grand Lodge and subordinate lodges was not changed by enactment of Section 501(c)(10) by Tax Reform Act of 1969. BPOE tax attorney Edward W. McCabe had a meeting on February 5, 1970 with four representatives of Internal Revenue Service Exempt Organizations Office. As reported by Mr. McCabe, "It was the consensus of those attending the conference that the Elks should continue to be exempt under Section 501(c)(8) rather than change to 501(c)(10)."

¹ Mr. McCabe reported those in attendance for Internal Revenue Service as Mr. Dunn, John Barber, Robert Maginnis, and Ed Coleman.

7. That position was confirmed by Exempt Organizations Office as shown by letter dated June 17, 1981 from Donald E. Bergherm, District Director, Internal Revenue Service which stated as follows:

Our National Office has advised us that since the benefits provided by the Grand Lodge are available to the members of the individual lodges, those benefits are considered other benefits to the members under I. R. C. 501 (c) (8)(B).

The Grand Lodge and its subordinate Lodges will continue to be recognized under section 501 (c) (8) of the Internal Revenue Code if they meet the requirements of (A) and (B) as mentioned above.

Conclusions

A. There can be no question that each subordinate lodge of BPOE, listed in the group exemption, is exempt under Section 501(c)(8). As stated in Internal Revenue Manual, 25.7.3.1 (09-20-2006), "A central organization that is tax exempt under IRC 501(c) may obtain recognition of exemption, on a group basis, for subordinate organizations that are under its general supervision and control. The purpose of the group exemption is to relieve subordinate organizations from filing their own exemption applications." (Also stated in Publication 557, "Tax-Exempt Status for Your Organization," at page 6: If there is a central organization group exemption letter, "you do not have to file a separate application unless your organization no longer wants to be included in the group exemption.")

- B. Determination of tax exempt status and group exemption is the responsibility of TE/GE Headquarters (HQ) in Cincinnati, Ohio or the Area Office (AO) which has jurisdiction for the area in which the central organization's principal place of business is located. (Internal Revenue Manual 25.7.3.1.2 (12-01-2002))
- C. BPOE Grand Lodge and its subordinate lodges have been granted exemption under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code by the Internal Revenue Service officials having the responsibility and authority for examining and issuing tax exemption determinations. These rulings establish that that BPOE Grand Lodge and all its listed subordinates are exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code.
