JULY 2025 SURVEY: 201 RESPONSES

The City conducted a community survey to assess challenges and priorities related to three major areas: access, facility improvements, and land acquisition for green space expansion. A survey in winter 2025 was also conducted and high level results were placed within this survey, so the data below is not encompassing that input.

1. Access to Parks

Respondents highlighted a variety of barriers that limit park accessibility, especially for pedestrians, cyclists, and individuals with limited mobility. Safety and connectivity were primary themes.

Key Concerns:

- **Boardman Loop & Boardman Lake:** Poor east-side access, limited trail continuity, and safety issues along pedestrian paths.
- **Slabtown and Hickory Hills:** Limited public transportation, steep terrain, and insufficient signage.
- **Crosswalk Safety:** Requests for safer crossings to parks near busy roads.

Most Cited Difficult-to-Access Parks:

- Boardman Lake
 - Hickory Hills
 - Slabtown-area parks
 - Isolated neighborhood parks with limited street access or no sidewalks

2. Park Improvements

A strong majority of respondents (over 80%) shared specific ideas to improve infrastructure, facilities, and programming in both neighborhood and major parks.

Top Requested Features:

- **Restrooms:** More public restrooms downtown, at beaches, and in major parks
- **Water Amenities:** Splash pads, interactive fountains, and beach improvements
- **Dog Facilities:** Off-leash dog parks and dog-friendly beaches
- **Sports & Recreation:** Pickleball courts, basketball courts, shaded seating areas
- **Family & ADA Access:** Inclusive play structures, stroller-friendly trails, shaded picnic areas

3. Land Acquisition & Green Space Equity

Nearly 3 in 4 respondents believe some areas of the city are underserved by public green space. Encouragingly, **91%** support the creation or expansion of parks in those neighborhoods.

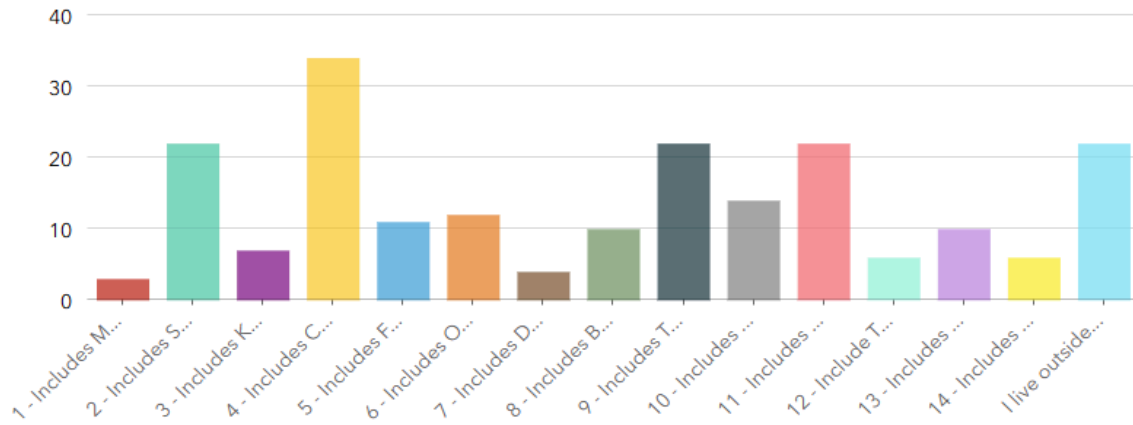
- Traverse Heights
